Massachusetts Water Research Authority engages New Dimension Solutions, Inc to expand their Reliability Centered Maintenance program.

New York, May 16, 2006 — New Dimension Solutions, Inc (NDS) www.nd-solutions.com will train and mentor 5 additional Reliability Centered Maintenance (RCM) facilitators to assist Massachusetts Water Research Authority (MWRA) in the further expansion of its program.

MWRA has maintenance responsibility for the 3.8 billion dollar Deer Island Treatment Plant. Deer Island is the second largest wastewater treatment facility in the nation, designed to treat 1.2 billion gallons-per-day.

MWRA's decision to train more facilitators is part of their ongoing strategic Facilities Asset Management Program (FAMP). New Dimension Solutions (previously Spearhead) was awarded the Facilities Asset Management Program (FAMP) Phase 1 contract in 2000.
